Senate Committee on Student Discipline and Subcommittee Trainings

1. SCSD/SUSC/SGSC Training: OSCR staff members conducted training sessions for all members of the subcommittees and the SCSD. New and returning SCSD members participated in basic training at the first scheduled business meeting. New SUSC and SGSC members attended a four-hour training program on due process, questioning, sensitivity to social justice issues, sanctioning guidance, and deliberations. New and returning SUSC, SGSC, and SCSD members attended a four-hour mock hearing for a physical

- violence case in order to practice and develop their questioning and deliberation skills as well as to discuss the unique challenges and issues related to campus violence.
- 2. Subcommittee on Sexual Misconduct Training: Over three 8-hour sessions in late August and early September of 2016, OSCR trained the new members of the Subcommittee on Sexual Misconduct along with new members of the Senate Committee on Student Discipline who would be responsible for hearing appeals in sexual misconduct cases (Returning members of both groups joined the new members during the second session to complete their annual training requirements). This training, though designed by OSCR staff, was a strong collaborative effort, as we invited student affairs colleagues, academic colleagues, and professionals within the local community to address the trainees.

Senate Committee on Student Discipline Actions

- 1. *Appeal Decisions:* At the suggestion of one of the members, the SCSD voted to change the requirement that two-third of the voting members of an appeal committee must agree to modify or reverse a decision. All SCSD/SUSC/SGSC appeal decisions now require only a simple majority.
- 2. Gender-Inclusive Language in the Student Disciplinary Procedures: At the suggestion of the OSCR Director, the SCSD voted to replace all gender-specific references in the Student Disciplinary Procedures with gender-neutral pronouns.
- **3.** Registered Student Organization Formal Sanctions: The SCSD voted to remove Suspension as a possible formal sanction in organizational cases and to revise the definition of Revocation.
- **4.** *Sanctioning Guidance for Organizational Cases:* Under the direction of OSCR staff and in consultation with Fraternity and Sorority Affairs, the SCSD created a sanctioning guidance document for organizational discipline cases. The guidance focuses on substance use, substance distribution, and hazing.
- **5.** *Student Disciplinary Procedures Revisions:* The SCSD considered several minor changes to the Student Disciplinary Procedures, including Appendix D, proposed by the Executive Director. These changes were either clarifications or slight adjustments to better match the practices of OSCR. All of these changes were approved.
- **6.** Subcommittee Selection: OSCR again led the effort to advertise for and select the new members of the Subcommittees on Undergraduate Student Conduct, Graduate Student Conduct, and Sexual Misconduct. We received 52 applications and selected a total of 21 undergraduates, 4 graduate students, 6 faculty members, and 2 staff.
