## Senate Committee on Student Discipline REPORT ON ACADEMIC INTEGRITY VIOLATIONS - FY12

The Student Code requires that the Senate Committee on Student Discipline act as a clearinghouse of all academic integrity violations found by instructors, departments, and colleges. Specifically Section 1-406(d) states:

"At the end of each academic year, the executive director of the Senate Committee on Student Discipline shall compile an annual report to the Senate on the number and severity of such infractions of academic integrity, without identification of the individuals involved, and make that report available for open distribution and publication across campus."

This report reflects all violations of the academic integrity policy <u>reported</u> to the Senate Committee on Student Discipline which were fully resolved (appeal process has expired) from July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012. Cases which are still on appeal will be reflected in next year's report.

1-403(c)(1): a written notice of warning with a copy to the student's file in the office of the college in which the student is enrolled and to the Senate Committee on Student Discipline.

1/403(c)(2): a reduced grade on the assignment.

1-403(c)(3): a failing grade (zero if graded numerically) for the assignment.

1-403(c)(4): a reduced grade for the course.

1-403(c)(5): a failing grade for the course.

1-403(c)(7): any other penalty negotiated and agreed to, in writing, by both parties (not subject to appeal).

Other: no penalty assigned by instructor.

\* In addition to the reports listed above, twenty-four (24) additional students were found responsible for academic integrity violations\_in FY12, but are not included in the report. Twenty-two (22) students committed their second violation of the academic integrity policy and were sanctioned by a disciplinary hearing officer for repeated violations and were placed on probation.

Two (2) students were dismissed by the Subcommittee on Undergraduate Student Conduct after committing other very serious violations of the Student Code including the academic integrity policy. The Senate Committee on Student Discipline regards academic integrity violations seriously and appreciated the efforts of the faculty in confronting such violations and reporting them to the institution.
