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ABBREVIATIONS AND DEFINITIONS

- **Case Coordinator (CC)**: a staff member empowered to adjudicate student disciplinary cases that would not result in suspension or dismissal
- **Complainant**: a person who claims to have been or is reported to have been a victim of sexual misconduct
- **Director**: the Director of the Office for Student Conflict Resolution and Executive Director of the Senate Committee on Student Discipline
- Office for Student Conflict Resolution (OSCR): the department responsible for overseeing the university's student discipline system
- **Residence Hall Judicial Commission (RHJC)**: a disciplinary hearing board made up of student justices who live in the residence halls
- **Respondent**: a student who is alleged to have violated the *Student Code*
- Sanction, Formal: a disciplinary status imposed by the university in response to a policy violation
- Senate Committee on Student Discipline (SCSD): the Senate committee responsible for establishing student disciplinary procedures, issuing sanctioning guidance to all hearing bodies, and deciding appeals of all subcommittee decisions
- Subcommittee on Graduate Student Conduct (SGSC): the group of trained faculty, staff, and graduate students responsible for deciding graduate student cases that could result in suspension or dismissal (and that do not include allegations of sexual misconduct)
- Subcommittee on Organizational Conduct (SOC): the group of trained faculty, staff, and students responsible for deciding Registered Student Organization (RSO) cases that could result in revocation of RSO status
- Subcommittee on Sexual Misconduct (SSM): the group of trained faculty, staff, and students responsible for deciding (1) all student cases that include allegations of Title IX sexual harassment, and (2) all other student cases that include allegations of sexual misconduct that could result in suspension or dismissal
- **Subcommittee on Undergraduate Student Conduct (SUSC)**: the group of trained faculty, staff, and undergraduate students responsible for deciding undergraduate student cases that could result in suspension or dismissal (and that do not include allegations of sexual misconduct)



SEXUAL MISCONDUCT CASES

The Subcommittee on Sexual Misconduct issued 17 decisions during this reporting period, none of which included allegations of Title IX Sexual Harassment (which are addressed under the procedures set out in <u>Appendix D</u> of the <u>Student Disciplinary Procedures</u>).⁺ Case Coordinators issued decisions in another 2 sexual misconduct cases. The statistics below describe these decisions and any subsequent appeals.
