STUDENT DISCIPLINE SYSTEM ANNUAL STATISTICS

July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025

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ABBREVIATIONS AND DEFINITIONS

- **Case Coordinator (CC):** a staff member empowered to adjudicate student disciplinary cases that would not result in suspension or dismissal
- **Complainant:** a person who claims to have been or is reported to have been a victim of sexual misconduct
- **Director:** the Director of the Office for Student Conflict Resolution and Executive Director of the Senate Committee on Student Discipline
- **Office for Student Conflict Resolution (OSCR):** the department responsible for overseeing the university's student conduct system
- **Respondent:** a student who is alleged to have violated the *Student Code*
- **Informal Resolution: Notice of Policy** – a minor policy violation that may result in the student not being aware of a specific policy. The letter-only interaction is to instruct the student what the policy is and a supporting rationale for it. The student is expected to comply with community expectations. No conduct record is created.
- **Informal Resolution: Diversion** – a slightly less minor policy violation or a repeated minor violation (i.e., quiet hours violation in a residence hall) where the student is given a 20-minute activity whose purpose is to serve as an educational outreach in lieu of the creation a conduct record.
- **Informal Resolution: Meeting** – a one on one meeting with a case coordinator were a discussion ensues about community expectations within the university setting. There is an option to include a diversion activity (i.e., substance-related issues) to avoid the creation of a conduct record.
- **Sanction, Formal:** a disciplinary status imposed by the university in response to a policy violation.
- **Senate Committee on Student Discipline (SCSD):** the Senate committee responsible for establishing student disciplinary procedures, issuing sanctioning guidance to all hearing bodies, and deciding appeals of all subcommittee decisions. The Senate Committee can reserve the right to take jurisdiction on any case, but typically reserves the right to cases whose facts patterns are extremely unique.
- **Subcommittee on Graduate Student Conduct (SGSC):** the group of trained faculty, staff, and graduate students responsible for deciding graduate student cases that could result in suspension or dismissal (and that do not include allegations of sexual misconduct)
- **Subcommittee on Organizational Conduct (SOC):** the group of trained faculty, staff, and students responsible for deciding student organization cases that could result in revocation of registered status
- **Subcommittee on Sexual Misconduct (SSM):** the group of trained faculty, staff, and students responsible for deciding (1) all student cases that include allegations of Title IX sexual harassment, and (2) all other student cases that include allegations of sexual misconduct that could result in suspension or dismissal
- **Subcommittee on Undergraduate Student Conduct (SUSC):** the group of trained faculty, staff, and undergraduate students responsible for deciding undergraduate student cases that could result in suspension or dismissal (and that do not include allegations of sexual misconduct)

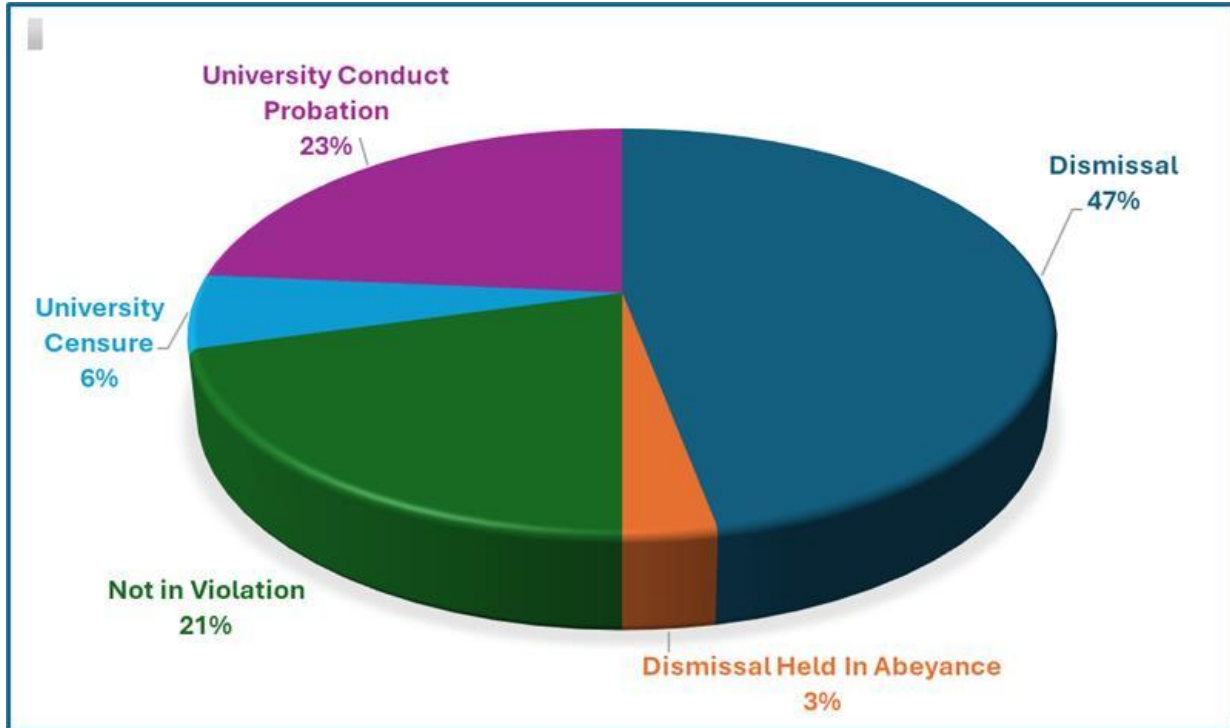
